Q2 What are the four steps you should undertake before making a call on a frequency?

- Listen to see if anyone is on the frequency.
- If nothing is heard, continue. If the frequency is in use, move to another frequency.
- Key the microphone and announce," This is VKyyyy, is this frequency in use?"
- If there is no answer you are free to make a call.
- Q3 How often should you announce your call sign?
  - At the beginning of a transmission
  - At the end of the transmission
  - Every 10 minutes during a transmission
- Q4 How many times should you announce the call signs when making a call on HF? **Three times.**
- Q5 What does the abbreviation CQ mean? Calling anyone.
- Q6 What does the abbreviation DX mean? **DX is a distant call.**
- Q7 Explain the following Q codes.

QRL – Are you busy?	l am busy.
<b>QRM</b> - Are you being interfered with?	I am being interfered with (M= manmade)
<b>QRN</b> - Are you troubled by static?	I am troubled by static (N=noise)
<b>QRZ</b> - Who is calling me?	You are being called by
QSL - Can you acknowledge receipt?	I am acknowledging receipt (L=letter)
<b>QSO</b> - Can you communicate with direct?	I can communicate with direct.
QSY - Shall I change frequency?	Change to another frequency.
<b>QTH</b> – What is your location?	My location is (H=home)

- Q8 If you hear the following calls, what do they mean?
  - 1. "CQ Europe CQ Europe CQ Europe this is VK3vvv VK3vvv VK3vvv over."

## VK3vvv in Victoria Australia is calling any station in Europe.

2. "VK2xxx VK2xxx VK2xxx this is VK6yyyy VK6yyyy VK6yyyy over."

## VK6yyy in Western Australia is calling VK2xxx in New South Wales.

3. "This is VK3yyyy listening on the Geelong repeater".

## VK3vvv is in Victoria on VHF or UHF calling anyone on the Geelong repeater.
